WATER & SEWER FEES



New residents must pay a \$50 connection fee and a \$215 (5/8" meter) or \$240 (3/4") refundable water meter deposit prior to your scheduled connection date. An appointment must be made at City Hall for the date and time of water connection. While making your appointment, consider signing up for e-billing or come back at a later date.

Residents of Melville receive monthly water and sewer utility bills. Effective January 1, 2025, the utility rates are as follows:

<i>Monthly Water Service Charge</i>	<i>\$56.85</i>
<i>Monthly Sewer Service Charge</i>	<i>\$16.00</i>
<i>Monthly Waste & Recycling Charge</i>	<i>\$31.53</i>
<i>Monthly Infrastructure Levy</i>	<i><u>+\$27.25</u></i>
	<i>\$131.63</i>

In addition to the base charges, residents are also charged for usage of services.

- *Water* - *\$3.032* per cubic metre of water used
- *Sewer* - *58%* of the total water used

Bills can be paid with cheque, cash, debit, pre-authorized debit, or through your online banking.

4. All bills that are sent to you by email shall be due and payable on the "due date" of each bill. UTILITY E-BILLING

E-Billing Questions & Answers

Does this change how I pay my utility bill?

Choosing to sign up for e-billing will not affect the way you pay your utility bills. Customers will continue to have the following options for payment: Pre-Authorized payments, Cash, Debit, Credit Card, Online/Telephone Banking or at your financial institution.

What if I change my mind and want to revert back to paper billing?

If you ever decide to stop the e-billing notification service, simply e-mail your request to: utilitybilling@melville.ca or contact Utility Billing at (306) 728-6850.

What should I do if I have not received my e-bill when I expected it?

Once your application is received, we will e-mail the address provided. You will need to reply to our email and confirm your name, address, and account number to complete the application process. If you have not received your e-bill, please check your junk mail or spam folder. To ensure you receive your utility e-bill notification from City of Melville, please add the email addresses "utilitybilling@melville.ca" and "kweber@melville.ca" to your safe senders list. If your e-bill is not in your junk or spam folder, please contact (306) 728-6850.

Why did I get a paper bill even though I signed up for e-billing?

You may have signed up for e-billing after your current month's billing cycle closed and your bill was already printed. You should start receiving an e-bill on your next billing cycle.

PLEASE NOTE:

If you change your email address or service address, you will be responsible for contacting the Utility Billing Department at the City of Melville with that information and to fill out a new application form. If the bill is not paid by the due date, overdue notices will be sent by paper-based mail. Customers using the utility e-billing service are subject to standard late fees, as well as standard non-payment water shut-off and/or transfer-to-tax procedures. WHEN, WHERE, & HOW TO PAY

Taxes are due August 31 without penalties. Starting on September 1st, penalties amounting to 1.25% of current balance owing will be applied for each month left unpaid. All balances outstanding as of December 31 will be subject to a 1.5% penalty that will be assessed January 1 and will continue on the first of each month until taxes are paid in full.

Taxes can be paid through telephone/online banking or at City Hall. We accept cash, cheques and debit. Please remember that the City of Melville does NOT accept credit card payments on taxes. All cheques must be made payable to the City of Melville.

TIPP PROGRAM

The City of Melville offers a Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP). The TIPP program is an automatic withdrawal payment plan which allows City taxpayers to spread their tax payments over the course of the year (12 months) penalty and interest free. Payments are withdrawn on the 1st, 15th or 30th of each month. Application forms for the TIPP program are available at City Hall and on page 9.

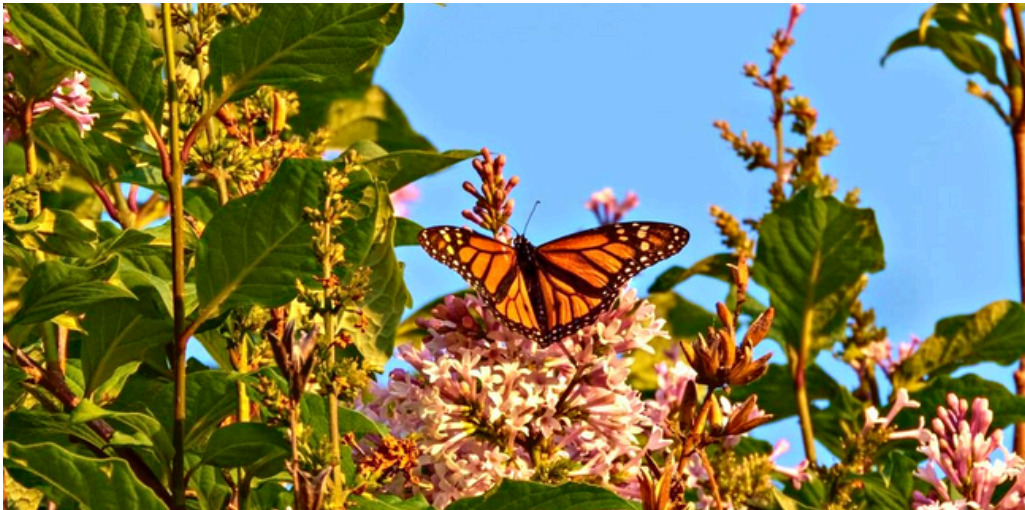

All waste is collected on a bi-weekly basis according to the calendar and zones. Bins must be placed on curbside before 7am on the day of collection.

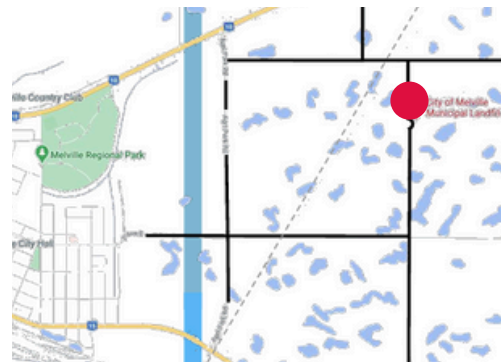

Residential Recycling & Garbage Collection Zone Map

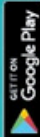

ACCESSIBLE VAN SERVICES

Eligibility:

All persons with special needs, living within the City of Melville are eligible to make use of this transportation service.

Service Types:

Subscription Service – is for regularly scheduled travel. The van will arrive at the same time Monday to Friday to pick you up. (ex. If you are in a wheelchair and require transportation to your job Monday to Friday)

Demand Service – is for sporadic trips. You will need to call and arrange pick up ahead of time. (ex. Ride to the doctor or a funeral if you are unable to take other transportation) (note that priority is given to the subscription service clients)

Hours of Operation:

Monday to Friday 7:00am to 6:00pm

The first Saturday and Sunday of each month. 8:00am to 10:00pm

To schedule a pick up for the first Saturday or Sunday of the month,
24 hours notice is required.

Exceptions to these hours may be given, at the discretion of the van contractor.

** Passengers who require assistance may be accompanied by one other person at no charge when travelling to and from the same address. Escorts picked up and returned to different locations will be charged the full fare.

**** The Accessible Van cannot be requested for emergency cases. An Ambulance must be called. The Accessible Van is not equipped to handle a medical emergency.**

Transportation Fees:

- \$20.00 per passenger for a round trip
- \$10.00 per passenger for a one-way trip
- \$15.00 per passenger for outside of City Limits, plus \$1.50 per kilometre
- \$25.00 per group maximum charge (each way) if group is picked up or delivered at one destination

NOTABLE BYLAWS

FIRE PIT & FIRE PREVENTION

Before starting a recreational fire, a permit must be obtained from the Fire Chief and must be renewed annually for a fee of \$20.

- The fire must be contained in a manufactured, non-combustible appliance designed to be used as a fire pit.
- The firepit must be approved by the Fire Chief.
- All fuel must be charcoal briquettes or seasoned wood.
- Prohibited fuels: cardboard, rubbish, garden/lawn refuse, and manure.



NOISE

Use of any machine or device which is powered with an internal engine in any residential area is prohibited between the hours of

- 10PM and 7AM on a weekday and
- 10PM and 8AM on a Sunday or holiday.

For construction work, no person is to use any machine of a noisy nature between the hours of:

- 10PM and 6AM on a weekday and
- 10PM and 8AM on a Sunday or a holiday.

Anyone who violates the Noise Bylaw would be charged accordingly. For the first offence, the fine is \$300, the second offence carries a fine of \$500, and for a third or subsequent offence is a fine not less than \$700 and not more \$10,000.

CURFEW

No child under the age of 15 shall be in a public place between 11PM-6AM, unless accompanied by a parent. A child found in a public place by a peace officer will be warned to return home and if disobeyed, will take the child home. Any parent who permits unaccompanied minors to break this bylaw will be subject to a fine starting at \$250.

SIDEWALK CLEARING

All persons who own or occupy premises as outlined on the map, must clear their sidewalks of any snow, ice, dirt, or other obstructions within 24 hours of the blockage.

SHRUBS AND FENCES

- Residential fences will not exceed 1m in the front yard and 2m in side and rear yards.
- Fences and shrubs along a street must be 5m back from the corner of the lot.
- Above-ground pools must be surrounded by a fence of at least 1.8m.

ANIMALS

- All dogs and cats must be licensed for the current year and wear the tag.
- All animals must be kept on a leash when off private property of the owner.
- No owner shall allow an animal to bark, whine, or howl excessively.
- No person is allowed to keep venomous reptiles and amphibians, live poultry, livestock, and/or bees within the City of Melville.

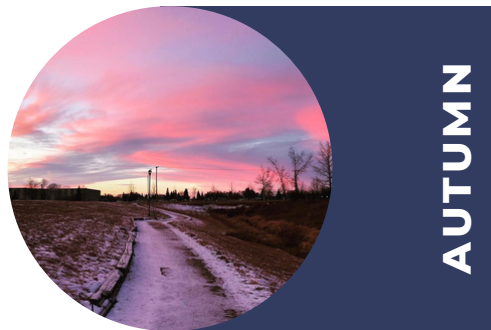
